



We operated K1WAS in the 2025 NEQP from WAS in Westport (CTWES) in the multi-op, multi transmitter (unlimited) category. Operators included AI1V, W1SMF, WA1SFH, KB1LZ, N3DAW, K1RF & KB1LTW. We used N1MM Logger+ for the first time on 3 stations, which gave us many headaches. From network access problems to fatal errors on initial startup after installation. While we can attest to neophyte errors, however fatal errors upon initial startup after installation can not be attributed to us. Perhaps we will attack our learning curve this summer during summer contest season.

We tried out our new Band Pass filters, triplexer and filter chokes. David KB1LTW reports they work extremely well and have tamed our interference problems. Nice work all involved.

We made a total of 322 contacts, 233 CW and 89 phone. The discrepancy between N1MM Logger+ and N3FJP is one dupe. Please ignore it. CW seemed to be the most productive with 20m and 40m about even. USA and Canada ruled the day, perhaps because Europe would not have any interest in NE counties. Canada would be drawn into this contest due to it's proximity to New England and ease of contact. We worked 45 states and 4 Canadian Provinces. We worked all but 1 New England County (area), missing only the Northeast section of CT.

Thanks go out to all who helped set up, all who made contacts, all who kept us running and all who took down our systems. Special thanks go to Westport Astro Society for allowing us to use their facility. I contacted Scott N3FJP and he said he would add Multi Transmitter capability to the NEQP software for next year. Thank you Scott !




