Operating K1WAS this year was Steve K1RF, David KB1LTW, Rusty K4SAA, Tom AC1CK, Jon AI1V, Jim KC1RBG, Larry AB1JC and Jeff KB1LZ. Set up began Friday afternoon utilizing the Off Center Fed dipole, 160-10 meter dipole, hex beam and 40 meter dipole.

Ned KA1CVv cooked a stupendous breakfast on Saturday morning before the contest. Lunch and dinner included Big Y grinders and homemade Chili.

We set up 3 stations indoors and operated 3I CT. Modes included SSB, CW, PSK Digital, JS8Call Digital and satellite. Three antennas were set up just for WFD. Dan N3DAW and Alex N1AK helped set up a satellite station outside, and David KB1LTW made a contact through the ISS Digi-peter. Our sign-in sheet indicates we had at least 25 licensed ham operators visit our WFD gathering.









ISS Digi contact grid square in west FL





Working with mesh network





Based upon our database, we made 486 CW contacts, 564 phone contacts and 74 digital contacts for 1124 contacts. This translates to 1,684 points.

We achieved the following Objective Multipliers:

Operate 6 continuous hours	x2

So our "rough" scores, prior to dupe removal, etc. Is 1,684 x 17 = 28, 628.
