
MEETING INFO

NEW ENGLAND QSO PARTY

We operated N1KT in the New England QSO Party on May 1-2, 2021. 10 members attended and had a really fun time. We operated using the OCF Dipole with an ICOM 7000 driving an ACOM 700 watt amp (as our contact station) and the 4BTV on the north tower with the IC 7300 driving our Ameritron amp (as our multiplier station). We operated in the Multi-operator, single transmitter category with our one contact station and one multiplier station. A multiplier station can not call CQ nor can it work just any station, but can only work multipliers (and only multipliers) via hunt and pounce. Our score below is the combined efforts of both stations. Here are some snippets from N3FJP software.


Our claimed score is 23,700, consisting of 395 contacts with 60 multipliers. 40 meters was our most productive band, with 271 contacts (69%). Next was 20 meters with 26 contacts. While this may not seem like much, 20 meters provided 10 DX countries and AR and MS making 12 multipliers. Not bad out of 104 contacts. We only operated for less than 1 hour on 80 meters, so there was not much action there.


Our multipliers were states, Canadian provinces and DX. (blue is worked, red is needed)












New England Counties Worked













20 meters SSB



40 meters SSB
















80 meters SSB













SOUTHERN BERKSHIRE (GOSHEN) HAMFEST

K1WAS REPEATER


